**PEACE SUNDAY 2026:** Peace Sunday is today Sunday 18th January. Pope Leo has announced the theme – **'Peace be with you all: Towards an 'unarmed and disarming peace'** – and has continued the exhortation of Pope Francis that the call to live nonviolent 'disarmed' lives is core to Catholic Social Teaching and the key to peace in a world scarred by violent conflict. The Bishops' Conference encourages us all to use the day to reflect on the Pope's message for the World Day of Peace on the 1st January. On Peace Sunday, Pax Christi ask for support for their work which includes promoting nonviolence as a way of resolving conflict, advocacy and campaigning for peace and peace education in schools. **SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 19<sup>th</sup> January: St Wulston Bishop (1008-1095)** He spent the early days of his priesthood in a monastery at Worcester and stayed there for 25 years. He was much admired for his humility and asceticism. Eventually elected (very reluctantly on his part) as Bishop of Worcester in 1062. After some initial difficulties with both Canterbury and York he came to work closely with Lanfranc of Canterbury. Together they managed to suppress the slave trade at Bristol. He administered his diocese with great effectiveness and tried hard to smooth the transition of England from Anglo-Saxon Kingdom to Norman conquest.

**\*\*\*NEW\*\*\*TOWARDS A SYNODAL CHURCH – CONVERSATIONS IN THE SPIRIT: Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> February, Blessed Sacrament, Exeter, 9.30-3.30.** How do we listen to each other well? How do we step back from our own agendas to be attentive to where the Spirit is moving? How can we make better decisions about organising ourselves as Christian communities? How do we enrich our parish communal life with enriching conversations? The Synod process has emphasised the importance of listening and good conversations in our community life. However, these are not always so easy in practice!

Blessed Sacrament Exeter are hosting a one day face-to-face facilitator training workshop with Fr Matthew Nunes, Director of the School for Synodality. This Conversations in the Spirit workshop will run on Saturday 21st February and will introduce the principles of holding prayerful, truthful and safe conversations which value gracious listening and courageous speaking.
