PRISONERS' SUNDAY 12TH OCTOBER: Prisoners' Sunday is the National Day of Prayer and Action for prisoners and their dependents as marked by the Catholic Church and across the Christian denominations. Today we reflect on how we as individuals, as a Church, and as a community are serving those affected by imprisonment.

NEW SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 12th October: St Wilfrid (c.634-709) His was a turbulent and controversial life. Educated by Celtic monks at Lindisfarne he became more and more influenced by the Roman form of Christianity prevalent at Canterbury. He travelled there to study it and then to Rome. On his return to England he was made Abbot of Ripon and introduced the Benedictine Rule there. He greatly influenced the Synod of Whitby (664) which rejected the Celtic form of Christianity in favour of the Roman one. He was then made Bishop of York. His tenure of office was not without controversy. Despite the many controversies he was involved in he was a dedicated missionary and instrumental in establishing the Roman form of Christianity and the Benedictine model of monasticism in all of England where they remained dominant until the Reformation of the 16th Century, nearly a thousand years later.

17th October: St Ignatius of Antioch (d.107) Martyr Ignatius was second or third Bishop of Antioch, a see founded by St Peter. Nothing is known about him apart from his journey under arrest from Antioch to Rome where he was martyred. It was a slow progress and during it he wrote a number of letters to various Churches. These letters reveal a man passionately devoted to Christ who insists on both the Divinity and Humanity of Christ, the Eucharist as a continuation of Christ's life and the importance of Bishops for the unity of the Church.

18th October: St Luke Author of both a Gospel and The Acts of the Apostles (very early history of the emerging Church). His gospel is noted for its many references to the women in Christ's life. He worked for a time with St Paul on some of his missions. Patron Saint of butchers, bookbinders, doctors, surveyors, artists and glassworkers.
